Biographical Note

Paul Desmond Brown (1893-1958) was an American illustrator of equestrian subjects. Brown was born in Mapleton, Minnesota, and his family moved to New York City in 1901 or 1902. Brown's father, Charles H. Brown, became a successful actor's agent in New York. Brown fell in love with horses at a trip to Madison Square Garden to see the National Horse Show in 1904.

Brown never completed high school, choosing instead to focus on drawing than other studies. He was never formally trained as an artist, but opened his own commercial art business at age 18. His business grew to prominence until Brown left to fight in World War I. After his return from the war, Brown married Harriett "Sallie" Smith in 1923 and build a house in Garden City on Long Island. They had three children: Geery, Whit and Nancy. Brown resided on Long Island the rest of his life.

Brown was prolific as an illustrator of horses and equestrian subjects. Although he is best known for his sketches and illustrations, Brown also experimented with other media, including oil paints. Brown also spent over three decades producing illustrations for Brooks Brothers catalogs, reportedly creating more than one thousand drawings for the catalogs.

Brown also began a writing career in the 1930s, writing and illustrating 32 books, 19 of which were intended for children. He drew illustrations for over 100 books authored by other writers.
